

BOOKING PROCESS - NORFOLK PROPERTY DINNER

We are pleased to announce that the NFCI Norfolk Property Dinner will be held on Thursday 7 February 2019 at Norwich City Football Club.

The entertainment this year will be Simon Evans, Comedian (Radio 4 Simon Evans Goes to Market, Live at the Apollo and Edinburgh Comedy Fest Live).

The booking system in more recent years has meant that everybody who applied within the timescale were offered spaces, however, **due to the increasing popularity of the event, we are expecting to be allocating a larger number of shared tables this year.**

The booking process for the 2019 Dinner will be:

- **All those applying for tickets must be current NFCI members.** Membership reminders were sent recently so please check that your payment has been made (Corporate £150 p.a./Individual £15.00 p.a.). Payment for this can be made by cheque or BACS.
- An Application Form for the Dinner will be emailed to all members in due course. This should be returned, **with a completed cheque**, by the closing date on the form. **No BACS payments will be accepted and please do not send payment now, any received without the booking form will be returned.**
- The cost per ticket will be £75.00 for individual tickets / £750.00 for 10 spaces. Cheques payable to 'NFCI', VAT is not applicable.
- As mentioned above, the event is likely to be over-subscribed so the maximum number of spaces per Corporate member is limited to 10. Individual members will be limited to one space and group organisations or companies with multiple Corporate memberships will be subject to ticket restrictions also. Please do not assume that you have been allocated the number of spaces applied for and please note, as above, a large proportion of those who apply will be placed on a shared table.
- You will be notified around the end of November whether you have been successful in your application, at this time your cheque will be banked. If you have not received the number of spaces applied for, a refund will be made.
- Every effort will be made to ensure a fair allocation takes place, however, the Council's decision will be final.
